Progression

Within every transdisciplinary theme, the books have been levelled to ensure a progression for readers throughout.

The first green book within each theme is intentionally designed to be less advanced than the second green book, and the same pattern applies to the two orange books. The end result is a gradual increase in complexity as readers move through each theme.

Book band colours have been applied to the main text of each book to indicate an approximate level for independent reading. However, there are also additional facts, discussion points and jokes that benefit from guided or class reading and push the books beyond the traditional levelled reader. These highly engaging elements are designed to bring the books to life for students, encouraging further exploration and inquiry.

How humour is used

In each *PYP Agents* book, there are speech bubbles with jokes, puns and humour, alongside the images in the text. Humour promotes engagement – an essential component of learning.

A reference sheet is provided to help explain any of the puns and wordplay in the books.
